Approval of Agenda: Adrianna requested an addition to the agenda - to discuss playground at the end - Motion to approve the agenda was made by Samantha, seconded by Cara.

Principal's Report:

- Land Acknowledgement
- Mermil Products (Travis Walker) has committed to donating the supply and install of the
 playground structure in the Primary Yard he has been in touch with KPR and
 Henderson Playgrounds there will be no invoice to Kent, the structure will just arrive they have scheduled the installation for the beginning of July (donation valued at
 approximately \$11,000)
- This will leave Council with approximately \$12 000 dedicated to playground, and \$16 000 if grant is approved by the CFCSN
- Some suggestions made were:
 - to look into installation of 'Twist Climber' for Junior Yard equipment and installation quote is almost \$7,000 and we will likely need to look into some sort of surface will have to get quote for surface
 - -purchase two tether balls for existing poles in Junior yard (approximately \$220.00)
 - -put money aside for future playground inspections (which Council has to do yearly up to \$1000/year)
 - -replenish sand box in primary yard and track and field jumping pits in Junior yard will have to get a quote
 - -move climber from Primary to Junior as previously discussed will have to get a quote -Council needs to decide where funds for Florabunda Seeds and remaining Hot Lunch is going
- PRO Grant was approved for Zoo To You \$979.25 we changed our program which will only cost \$819.25 – we can spend up to \$97.00 on refreshments. Looked into Tim Horton prices – approximately \$23 for a box of coffee, approximately \$25 for box of hot chocolate, approximately \$11 for 50 Tim Bits. Curriculum connection document is created

- Last year's presentation Tribal Dance ended up being paid for by the school budget instead of the School Council – which left Council with a larger opening balance than expected this September
- Council was reminded about their commitment last year to Grad Lunch and Play Day as being yearly events
- Intermediate Basketball is on the go Mrs. Marshall (girls) and Madame Gale (boys)
- Ms. Morford has opened a Homework Club on Day 5 at second break
- Ms. Gage and Ms. Richardson have a Games Club for the Grade 8's on Mondays and Wednesdays
