- Will continue with Chicken Fingers
- Florabunda Seeds did it last year and it made about \$680 should aim for February and make it school cash friendly Sarah will look into
- Poinsettias (what is the return? A few dollars for each plant? Somewhere local? Vikings?
   Bradford Greenhouses has a 50% profit and different price points to meet different family incomes) Melissa will look into
- Guide Dog Calendars (50% profit) Adrianna will look into
- Empire Cheese (we will give this fundraiser a break for this school year)
- Golf Tournament Fundraiser (plan for a September one school year?)
- Canadian Safety Supplies (40% return but from experience orders have arrived incorrectly and then either need to be returned or reimbursed)
- MacMillans (cookie dough, food, etc. Sarah will look into) for around Easter
- Another Hot Lunch Idea through Robin's Nest (Tuesday Pasta) cost Council \$5 and will charge \$6 to cover School Cash fees - so small profit margin towards fundraising goals (try for the month of November to see how it goes) - Paula will look into
